

Trail Use Opportunities

Snowmobile Routes

West End of the County

Each town has its own ordinance regarding snowmobile use within the town's limits. Snowmobilers are responsible for knowing the ordinances for the area in which they are traveling.*

Kremmling: Snowmobiles may be operated on the designated streets and alleys of the town except on U.S. Highway 40 and State Highway 9. Such operation shall be solely for the purpose of gaining access to the nearest designated snowmobile routes for the purpose of entering and leaving public lands adjacent to the town. Snowmobile use is limited to between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. It is prohibited for snowmobilers to use sidewalks or pedestrian pathways. Snowmobilers must yield to all other users and must stop at all intersections and maintain a speed of 10 mph or less.

Hot Sulphur Springs: Snowmobile use is limited to between the hours 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. Snowmobile operation on public streets and rights-of-way is for means of access to and from the town limits and is not intended for recreational activities or purposes. Operator of less than 10 years of age must be supervised or accompanied by an operator of at least 16 years of age.

Grand County: has its own resolution regarding snowmobile routes within its municipal limits. As of 2009, the following county roads in Grand County are open to snowmobile travel. These routes are revised annually by the Grand County Board of County Commissioners. Please check for subsequent updates and annual changes with Headwaters Trails Alliance:

- CR10 From Highway 9 to Dice Hill (the full length).
- CR14 From U.S. Highway 40 west to the intersection of CR14N and 14M.
- CR14M From the intersection of CR14 to the National Forest Service Boundary
- CR2 From the intersection of CR23 to CR26.
- CR20 Parshall Divide, access to Smith Mesa; From Hot Sulphur Springs town limits west to U.S. Highway 40 at Parshall.
- CR21 From the intersection of CR214 to Highway 125.
- CR22 From Kremmling town limits to CR23.
- CR23 From the intersection of CR22 north to CR2.
- CR25 In its entirety.

*It is the responsibility of the user to know all regulations that apply. County roads that enter into public lands, such as the U.S. Forest Service, are subject to the rules and regulations of those managing agencies. It is illegal to use a snowmobile on any route not designated as open or that is contrary to any element in each town's ordinance. Not adhering to these conditions could result in the issue of a summons and/or civil penalty. Snowmobiles must be registered with the State of Colorado.

Fee Areas - West Side

There is one recreation area on this side of the map that charges a fee for access and use of its facilities: Colorado River Water Conservancy District's Wolford Reservoir. Under the District's management, the majority of your entrance fees are reinvested in the designated area to maintain and improve facilities, visitor services, and natural resources stewardship. Fee stations for these areas are marked with a \$ symbol. (The fees listed below are for the 2009 season and are subject to change.)

Special Management Areas

Although public lands are yours to discover, it is also your responsibility to know the rules and regulations of the area you'll be visiting, as well as the risks and liabilities that may be incurred. Wilderness Areas are reserved for the most primitive forms of travel: by foot-which includes hiking, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing-and by horseback. Mountain biking is not allowed in these areas.

The Fraser Experimental Forest was established in 1937 for the primary purpose of forest and hydrology research. Recreational use of the Fraser Experimental Forest is presently a privilege and must not interfere with current and potential research. Please stay on designated roads and trails, camp only in designated sites, and travel at safe speeds when visiting this area.

Several of our access trails to public lands are permitted through private property. Please use only acknowledged routes and do not explore areas off these designated trails or you may jeopardize future access through private property.

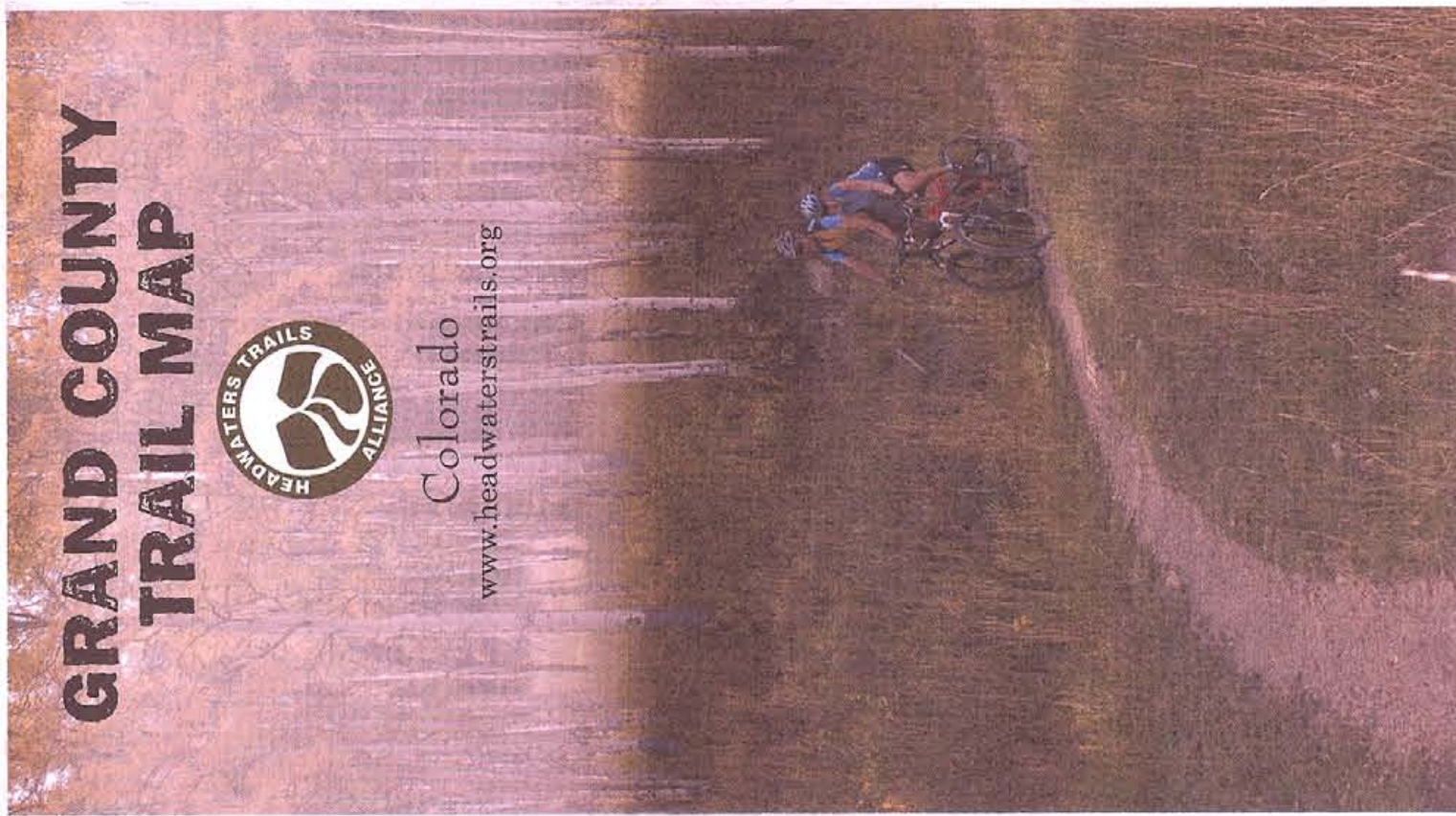
